First Premise¹ - Scripture first contending for “the faith” as entrusted to the Saints

Jude 1:5 (Berean Standard Bible)

Start with what Scripture says about the topic at hand.

For example,

Jesus Christ the Nazarene makes an assertion about John the Baptist, it is a declaration of John's greatness followed immediately by a statement of grace about those who are the “least.”

“Truly I say to you, among those born of women there has not arisen anyone greater than John the Baptist!”

— *Matthew 11:11a (NASB)*

“Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one greater than John the Baptist has appeared, but the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.”

Second Premise -

Prophetically Words & Works testify together - The Proof *is* by Works - the Word is ῥῆμα rhēma² a spiritual utterance, it is made Flesh in physical realm - Prophetic utterances in Scripture are fulfilled physically in the natural realm, for example, the Resurrection, spiritual rebirth, spiritual fruit be it good or bad, the destruction of the Temple was foretold & manifested in physical reality, *ε*³ eventually the physical appearance of Second Advent of Jesus Christ arriving with the clouds “every eye will see him.”

Hebrews 9:27-28 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

“And just as it is destined for people to die once, and after this comes judgment, so Christ also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time for salvation without reference to sin, to those who eagerly await Him.”

The Plumb Line

“Then Yahweh spoke [spiritually] his word to me.

He said, ‘Zerubbabel’s hands have laid the foundation of this house, and his hands will finish it [evidential works].

Then you will know that Yahweh Tsebaoth has sent me to you [exhibit]. Who despised the day when little things began to happen? They will be delighted when they see the plumb line in Zerubbabel’s hand [works]. (These seven eyes of Yahweh roam over all the earth.)”

— *Zechariah 4:8-10 (NOG)*

Scripturally, it would not be “prophecy” from Holy Spirit if it did not have fulfillment in verifiable works [evidence] — prophetic exhibits that testify that the utterances did indeed originate [spiritually] from YHWH Elohim to His servants through His Spirit glorifying His Son Jesus Christ the Nazarene — from Genesis to Revelation.

Our faith is an experiential faith, we experience God's love toward us and his creation, we experience his foreknowledge when he reveals hidden things to us, we participate in the Divine Nature. 🙌

The algorithm of cause-and-effect has always been critically important as a witness since YHWH began revealing Himself to humankind. There is no wiggle room in this. This was literally set in Stone from YHWH Elohim's inscribed Stone Tablets given on the sacred Mountain of Hebron to the Words (λόγος logos) of Jesus Christ the Chief Cornerstone — this *is* our Foundational Bedrock. Who is inside of us, Holy Spirit, manifests Himself outside through our words & deeds “known & read by everyone”

Christians display the works & speak the words of Jesus Christ through our daily lives as “living epistles known & read by everyone³.”

If we,

“wear the likeness of the man who came from heaven,”

[which we do, then our words should match His Words, precisely!]

“we all, with unveiled faces reflecting the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another, which is from the Lord, who is the Spirit.”

— *1 Corinthians 15:49c (NOG), 2 Corinthians 3:18 (NET Second Edition - Strong's)*

John 10:24-25 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

The Jews then surrounded Him and began saying to Him,

“How long will You keep us in suspense? If You are the Christ, tell us plainly.”

Jesus answered them,

“I told you, and you do not believe; the works that I do in My Father’s name, these testify of Me.”

“Soon afterward Jesus went to a city called Nain; and His disciples were going along with Him, accompanied by a large crowd.

Now as He approached the gate of the city, a dead man was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow; and a sizable crowd from the city was with her.

When the Lord saw her,

He felt compassion for her and said to her,

“Do not go on weeping.”

And He came up and touched the coffin; and the bearers came to a halt.

And He said,

“Young man, I say to you, arise!”

And the dead man sat up and began to speak.

And Jesus gave him back to his mother.

Fear gripped them all,

and they began glorifying God,

saying,

“A great prophet has appeared among us!” and,

“God has visited His people!”

And this report about Him spread throughout Judea and in all the surrounding region.

The disciples of John also reported to him about all these things.

And after summoning two of his disciples,

John sent them to the Lord, saying,

“Are You the Coming One, or are we to look for another?”

When the men came to Him [Jesus], they said,

“John the Baptist has sent us to You, to ask, ‘Are You the Coming One, or are we to look for another?’”

At that very time He cured many people of diseases and afflictions and evil spirits; and He gave sight to many who were blind.

And He answered and said to them,

“Go and report to John what you have seen and heard: people who were blind receive sight, people who limped walk, people with leprosy are cleansed and people who were deaf hear, dead people are raised up, and people who are poor have the gospel preached to them. And blessed is anyone who does not take offense at Me.”

— *Luke 7:11-23 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)*

The Works & Prophetic Utterances from John the Baptist

- John the Baptist the first eyewitness confirming Jesus Christ as the Lamb of God

John 1:28-34 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

“These things took place in Bethany beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing people.

The next day he *saw Jesus coming to him, and *said,

“Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!

This is He in behalf of whom I said,

‘After me is coming a Man who has proved to be my superior, because He existed before me.’ [Even though John was born first.]

And I did not recognize Him, but so that He would be revealed to Israel, I came baptizing in water.”

And John testified, saying,

“I have seen the Spirit descending as a dove out of heaven, and He remained upon Him. And I did not recognize Him,

but He who sent me to baptize in water said to me,

‘He upon whom you see the Spirit descending and remaining upon Him, this is the One who baptizes in the Holy Spirit.’ And I myself have seen, and have testified that this is the Son of God.”

John 1:35-36 (NASB)

“Again the next day John was standing with two of his disciples, and he looked at Jesus as He walked, and *said, ‘Behold, the Lamb of God!’”

- John the Baptist the first eyewitness prophesying & confirming Jesus Christ was the One sent to baptize with Holy Spirit & Fire

Matthew 3:11 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

“As for me, I baptize you with water for repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.”

Luke 3:16 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

“John responded to them all, saying, ‘As for me, I baptize you with water; but He is coming who is mightier than I, and I am not fit to untie the straps of His sandals; He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.’”

- John the Baptist prophesied that “the true Light was coming into the world” that “enlightens every person”

John 1:6-9 (ESV)

“There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.

He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world.”

- John the Apostle wrote that Creator God was in the world yet the world did not recognize him

- John the Apostle prophesied that even YHWH's own people did not recognize YHWH their Elohim

- John the Apostle prophesied that the spiritual sperma of God would beget His true children

- John the Apostle prophesied we are not orphans but true children of God

- John the Baptist stood up to the religious & political rulers of his day

John 1:9 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

This was the true Light that, coming into the world, enlightens every person.

- John the Baptist prophesied the one who dove lands on

- John the Baptist prophesied the start of the Eternal Gospel “Repent or suffer”

- John the Baptist declared by prophesying the Baptism of the Holy Spirit

- John the Baptist declared by prophesying Baptism with Fire

- Holy Spirit uses John, the last Old Covenant prophet, in the ushering of the new Messianic Reformation

Excursus⁴

Hebrews 9:8-15 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

The Holy Spirit is signifying this, that the way into the holy place has not yet been disclosed while the outer tabernacle is still standing, which is a symbol for the present time.

Accordingly both gifts and sacrifices are offered which cannot make the worshiper perfect in conscience, since they relate only to food, drink, and various washings, regulations for the body imposed until a time of reformation. [until the time of the "new order."

Hebrews 9:10c (NIV, NET, CSB)]

But when Christ appeared as a high priest of the good things having come, He entered through the greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made by hands, that is, not of this creation; and not through the blood of goats and calves, but through His own blood, He entered the holy place once for all time, having obtained eternal redemption.

For if the blood of goats and bulls, and the ashes of a heifer sprinkling those who have been defiled, sanctify for the cleansing of the flesh, how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? For this reason He is the mediator of a new covenant, so that, since a death has taken place for the redemption of the violations that were committed under the first covenant, those who have been called may receive the promise of the eternal inheritance."

Scriptural Patterns, Icons & Prophetic Features Between Elijah & John the Baptist

Prophesying, Confronting Religious & Political Leaders, Declaring Salvation Through YHWH

1 Kings 18:16-18 (ESV)

So Obadiah went to meet Ahab, and told him. And Ahab went to meet Elijah.

When Ahab saw Elijah, Ahab said to him, "Is it you, you troubler of Israel?" And he answered, "I have not troubled Israel, but you have, and your father's house, because you have abandoned the commandments of the LORD and followed the Baals.

Matthew 14:1-10 (NASB)

At that time Herod the tetrarch heard the news about Jesus, and said to his servants, "This is John the Baptist; he has risen from the dead, and that is why miraculous powers are at work in him." For when Herod had John arrested, he bound him and put him in prison because of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip. For John had been saying to him, "It is not lawful for you to have her." Although Herod wanted to put him to death, he feared the crowd, because they regarded John as a prophet. But when Herod's birthday came, the daughter of Herodias danced before them and pleased Herod,

so much that he promised with an oath to give her whatever she asked. Having been prompted by her mother, she *said, "Give me here on a platter the head of John the Baptist." Although he was grieved, the king commanded it to be given because of his oaths, and because of his dinner guests. He sent and had John beheaded in the prison.

Mark 6:15-20 (ESV)

But others said,

"He [Jesus Christ] is Elijah."

And others said,

"He is a prophet, like one of the prophets of old." But when Herod heard of it, he said, "John, whom I beheaded, has been raised."

For it was Herod who had sent and seized John and bound him in prison for the sake of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, because he had married her.

For John had been saying to Herod, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." And Herodias (a Jezebel archetype who wanted Elijah dead) had a grudge against him and wanted to put him to death. But she could not, for Herod feared John, knowing that he was a righteous and holy man, and he kept him safe. When he heard him, he was greatly perplexed, and yet he heard him gladly."

John the Baptizer identifies YHWH

- Announces & Identifies the Chief Cornerstone of God's Kingdom Jesus [YHWH Saves] Christ

- John pours water for baptism & announces Jesus Christ who Baptizes with living water Holy Spirit

- John Announces the Living Seed, the Word of God made flesh, the Logos, Seeds of the Word

- John Announces He who will baptize with Holy Spirit Power & Fire

- John announces & identifies the sacrificial Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world

Both Ministries Demonstrated Evidence First Resulting In Belief

1 Kings 18:38-39 (NOG)

"So a fire from Yahweh fell down and consumed the burnt offering, wood, stones, and dirt. The fire even dried up the water that was in the trench. All the people saw it and immediately bowed down to the ground. 'Yahweh is Elohim!' they said. 'Yahweh is Elohim!'"

Hebrews 12:28-29 (KJV)

"Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which cannot be moved, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear: For our God is a consuming fire."

Deuteronomy 4:23-24 (NOG)

"Be careful that you don't forget the promise that Yahweh your Elohim made to you. Don't make your own carved idols or statues that represent anything Yahweh your Elohim has forbidden. Yahweh your Elohim is Esh Oklah [Consuming Fire], El Kanna [Jealous God]."

Both Elijah & John Received Heavenly Instructions

1 Kings 18:30-39 (NOG)

Then Elijah said to all the people,
"Come over here." So all the people came to him. He rebuilt Yahweh's altar that had been torn down.

Elijah took 12 stones, one for each of the tribes named after Jacob's sons. (Yahweh had spoken his word to Jacob: "Your name will be Israel.")

Elijah built an altar in Yahweh's name with those stones.

He also made a trench that could hold 12 quarts of grain around the altar.

He arranged the wood, cut up the bull, and put it on the wood.

He said,

"Fill four jars with water. Pour the water on the offering and on the wood."

Then he said,

"Do it again," and they did it again. Then he said, "Do it a third time," and they did it a third time.

The water flowed around the altar, and even the trench was filled with water.

Excursus

- Revelation 22:1-2 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

"And he showed me a river of the water of life, clear as crystal, coming from the throne of God and of the Lamb, in the middle of its street. On either side of the river was the tree of life, bearing twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit every month; and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations."

He said,

make known today that you are Elohim in Israel

And John testified, saying, "I have seen the Spirit descending as a dove out of heaven, and He remained upon Him. Elijah & John's Taunting Spirit

1 Kings 18:25-27 (NASB 2020 Strong's Bible)

So Elijah said to the prophets of Baal, "Choose the one ox for yourselves and prepare it first, since there are many of you, and call on the name of your god, but put no fire under the ox." Then they took the ox which was given them and they prepared it, and they called on the name of Baal from morning until noon, saying, "O Baal, answer us!" But there was no voice and no one answered. And they limped about the altar which they had made. And at noon Elijah ridiculed them and said, "Call

out with a loud voice, since he is a god; undoubtedly he is attending to business, or is on the way, or is on a journey. Perhaps he is asleep, and will awaken.”

1 Kings 18:25-27 (NOG)

Elijah told the prophets of Baal, “Choose one bull for yourselves. Prepare yours first, because there are more of you. Call on the name of your god, but don’t set the wood on fire.”

They took the bull he gave them, prepared it, and called on the name of Baal from morning until noon. They said, “Baal, answer us!” But there wasn’t a sound or an answer. So they danced around the altar they had made. At noon Elijah started to make fun of them. “Shout louder, since he is a god. Maybe he’s thinking, relieving himself, or traveling! Maybe he’s sleeping, and you have to wake him!”

The former is exhibited in the statements that John "came for (the purpose of) testifying" ((Jn. 1:7), and "now when they completed their testimony" (Rev. 11:7). The latter use is seen in such statements as, "and this is the testimony of John" (Jn. 1:19), and "the word of his testimony" ((Rev. 12:11).

As with the noun *martyrs* (“witness”), *martyria* can have a legal meaning, such as in Mk. 14:55ff. and Lk. 22:71, in the accounts of Jesus’ trial before the Jewish leadership. However, *martyria* is most frequently employed in the NT in the context of a testimony of or to Jesus or his gospel; e.g., “you people do not accept our testimony” (Jn. 3:11) and “your testimony about me” (Acts 22:18; also Jn. 1:7; Rev. 1:2; 12,17; 19,10).

2. Witness to Facts generally, and also to Truths or Views. But the stem words μάρτυς, μαρτυρεῖν and μαρτυρία also find a very general use outside the legal sphere. In so doing they undergo a broadening of meaning and thus come to be used in two senses. The group now refers not merely to the establishment of events or actual relations or facts of experience on the basis of direct personal knowledge. It signifies also the proclamation of views or truths of which the speaker is convinced. It thus relates to things which by their very nature cannot be submitted to empirical investigation. This distinction is plainly developed by Aristot. in Rhet., I, 15. Aristot. first compares πίστεις ἄτεχνοι and ἔντεχτοι, i.e., natural means of proof and those fashioned by methodical art (I, 2, p. 1355b, 35 f.).

2. The Use of μάρτυς, μαρτυρέω, μαρτυρία.

- a. In the Legal Sphere. In the LXX, too, μάρτυς belongs to the legal world and denotes the witness before the judgment, in the first instance the witness for the prosecution, cf. Nu. 5:13; 35:30; Deuteronomy 17:6, 7; 19:15.

The word “[martyr](#)”⁵ derives from the Greek word “witness” - a person who refuses to change their eyewitness testimony even unto death.
